House and Senate Continuing Resolution Bills vs. FY12 President's Budget Request

The following details the differences from H.R. 1 (-\$61.5B over FY10; -\$99.6B over FY11 request), the Senate's amendment 149 to H.R. 1 (-\$4.7B over FY10; -\$51B over FY11 request), and the President's proposed fiscal year 2012 budget request in core regional funding areas. Reductions are based on FY10 funding levels. Note: Funding levels are factored without stimulus or supplemental funding unless stated.

General Provisions – H.R. 1 vs. Senate Amendment 149

The following details the general provisions most relevant to local governments and regional planning organizations.

H.R. 1	Senate Amendment 149
Provides funding until September 30, 2011 – end of FY11	Provides funding until September 30, 2011 – end of FY11
Bans earmarks in bill	Bans earmarks in bill
Prevents FEMA from providing funding from State and Local Programs to fund Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) beyond the top 25 high risk areas	
Prevents funding from being used to pay salaries/expenses for many executive branch offices, e.g. energy and climate change, green jobs, and urban affairs	
Prevents EPA from implementing, administering or enforcing any statute or regulation on emissions from any stationary sources	
Prevents funds from being used for the Community Connect Broadband Grant program in USDA	
Prevents USDA from implementing or enforcing the Travel Management Rule relating to the designation of roads, trails and areas for motor vehicle use	
Prevents funds from being used to develop, promulgate, evaluate, implement, provide oversight to or backstop total daily maximum load (TMDL) or watershed implementation plans for the Chesapeake Bay	
Prevents funds from being used to implement, administer or enforce the rule, "Water Quality Standards for the State of Florida's Lakes and Flowing Waters"	
Prevents funds from being used to implement, establish or create a NOAA Climate Service	
Prevents funds from being used to modify the national primary ambient air quality standard or the national secondary ambient air quality standard applicable to coarse particulate matter (dust)
