

## Program and Earmark Cuts

House Republicans unveiled their latest stopgap spending bill March 11. It would cut about \$6 billion in government spending, slicing \$2.7 billion from earmarked accounts and reducing or eliminating money for 25 government programs, many of which have already been targeted for elimination by Democrats.
