Dear Majority Leader Reid,

The National Association of Regional Councils (NARC) strongly urges the prompt passage, broad support and necessary override of any veto of the FY2008 Transportation-HUD appropriations bill (HR 3074) conference report, which would provide the much needed surface transportation and housing funds for critical projects in states, regions and local communities throughout the country.

NARC, representing local elected officials, Councils of Government (COGs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs), serves as the national voice for regionalism – advocating regional cooperation as the most effective way to address community planning, development and infrastructure issues. COGs and MPOs are responsible for billions of dollars in transportation and housing planning and programming each year, coordinating regional projects and operations throughout the country. There is an immediate need in regional agencies for adequate funding, as well as the necessary authority, to maintain and improve critical transportation and housing infrastructure that directly impacts citizens and businesses. Without the urgent appropriation and delivery of these funds, infrastructure deficiencies that cut across city, county and, often times, state boundaries will begin to have a negative impact on our communities.

As we are all aware, our country's transportation system is at a crossroads.
