Dear Chairman Mollohan and Ranking Member Frelinghuysen,  
The National Association of Regional Councils (NARC), which represents regional councils, councils of governments, and metropolitan planning organizations who in turn represent local elected officials nationwide, applauds your Subcommittee's efforts on passing the Commerce, Justice, and Science appropriations bill, which allots \$100 million more in funding for the Economic Development Administration (EDA). This is a promising start, but NARC advocates fully funding EDA at the FY2008 authorized level of \$500 million.

NARC strongly urges sustained and increased funding for EDA in order for communities to receive much needed planning, technical assistance and public works grants, which contribute to important projects that bolster economic and community development. Additionally, the increased funding supports maintaining adequate staff resources at EDA, particularly within its national network of economic development districts and regional and field offices, which play a central role in helping communities rebound from economic challenges, replace lost jobs and prepare for the future by developing critical economic and community facilities.

EDA is a critical agency for our members due to its ability to create and maintain jobs, as well as stimulate industrial and commercial growth in economically distressed areas, urban and rural alike. EDA programs have provided an invaluable resource to the nation's communities as they have moved to implement regional strategies that promote innovation and worldwide competitiveness. Continuance of these programs is vital to sustain the nation's posture in the world economy.
