EPA Delays Release of Stormwater Rulemaking: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced on January 31 that additional time is needed to develop a schedule for the release of the proposed and final EPA stormwater rules. This short-term extension pushes the release of the rulemaking schedule back from January 30 to March 16. It is expected that the proposed rule will be released no sooner than this Fall. Analysis to

transportation program, and Congress is two months into deficit reduction discussions. NARC will be releasing analysis of the transportation proposals from the Senate and House, along with providing a significant amount of time, keynote speakers and session discussion at the NCR. We will also hear from the White House and other speakers on the budget and deficit reduction talks, while Staff provides analysis of the budget and deficit actions for this year and next.

Of concern in all this activity is the fundamental shift away from a long and successful Federal/local partnership both from funding and programmatic standpoints. The NCR will be a pivotal venue for our regions to come together and set a course for collective action on protecting our role in supporting local governments.

Open Comment Period for Proposed EDA Regulations

Extended: Comment Period Extended through February 15, 2012. The U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration (EDA) published its proposed revised regulations based on external and internal feedback gathered through a public comment period earlier this year. Congress is in session.

Regional Infrastructure Improvement Zones: Congressman Geoff Davis (R-KY, 4) introduced H.R. 3780 to amend the federal tax code to allow for the establishment of Regional Infrastructure Improvement Zones (RIIZs). RIIZs would allow businesses or individuals in a community to contribute tax-deductible funds towards the construction or maintenance of public infrastructure – defined as surface transportation, water, waste water and storm water – if that infrastructure is part of an approved regional plan. This effort was led by the Ohio-Kentucky-Indiana Regional Council of Governments in conjunction with NARC. For additional information, contact Shannon Baxevanis, at shannon@narc.org or click HERE.

Federal Budget: The President will release his FY13 budget on Monday, February 13, a week late. The President has asked agencies to identify five percent in cuts with an eye for an additional five percent. Meanwhile, the House is working on several pieces of legislation to change and guide the budget process.

Funders' Network: Local Sustainability Matching Fund

Deadline: March 5, 2012

In partnership with the Urban Sustainability Directors Network, the Funders' Network is pleased to announce the formation of the Local Sustainability Matching Fund. The Fund has been created with leadership support from four Network members: the Kendeda Fund, the New York Community Trust, the Summit Foundation, and the Surdna Foundation.

The purpose of the **Local Sustainability Matching Fund** is: to catalyze partnerships between local government sustainability directors and local,

place-based foundations, including community foundations, and to advance important community-based sustainability initiatives. The Fund will provide partnership investments between \$25,000 and \$75,000, with a 1:1 match required by one or more local foundation. The Network anticipates that the Fund will support up to ten partnership projects in the first year in two rounds in the spring and fall of 2012.

The application deadline for the first round is March 5th, and you may download the Request for Proposals here. Applications must be submitted in MS Word and use the application Cover Sheet. The Network will host a conference call to provide more information on the fund and review the selection criteria. The call will be held on January 24th, at 2:00 p.m. Eastern, and you may register for the call by clicking here.

A selection committee comprised of foundation representatives and urban sustainability directors will make selection decisions on behalf of the matching fund, and awards will be announced on May 5, 2012.
