The National Academy of Public Administration (NAPA) is working on a report for Congress with recommendations on the effectiveness of grants administered by the U.S. Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), namely the State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSG) and the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI). To best assist NAPA in their assessment and provide the regional perspective, NARC respectfully requests members fill out a brief online survey that poses questions important to NAPA's effort. POLICYUPDATE

The Senate is in session; the House is out of session all week.

Senate Expected to Take Up EDA Reauthorization: This week the Senate is expected to take up legislation to reauthorize the Economic Development Administration (S 782). The bill, which passed favorably through the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee (EPW) in early May, should have strong bi-partisan support. That bill would authorize \$500 million a year for EDA through FY 2015 and would tweak EDA grant programs to encourage a focus on information technology, energy and water efficiency and reduce the nation's dependence on imported oil. Last week NARC sent a letter to EPW Chairman Boxer (D-CA) and Ranking Member Inhofe (R-OK) supporting

prompt passage of the bill. Click **HERE** to access the letter.

Senate Commerce Committee Scheduled to Markup Broadband Bill:

The Senate Commerce Committee is scheduled on June 8 to markup of legislation that would set aside the D-Block for public safety communications and authorize funding of a nationwide interoperable communication system (S 911), the Public Safety Spectrum and Wireless Innovation Act. NARC, along with many other associations, supports this bill. Visit the Public Safety Alliance's website to learn more.

House Passes Homeland Security Appropriations Bill: The House approved the FY12 homeland security appropriations bill (HR 2017), which would provide \$40.6 billion in discretionary funds, a 2.6 percent decrease from FY11 and 6.8 percent less than requested by President Obama for FY12. Of these funds, FEMA would be allocated \$5.4 billion, a decrease of \$1.9 billion or 26% from FY11, which includes \$1 billion for state and local grants, a reduction of \$2.1 billion or 55% from FY11. The bill would also combine funding for nine programs that have historically been separately funded at \$1 billion for FY12 (a \$1.043 billion reduction) with levels at the Secretary's discretion. The nine programs are State Homeland Security Grants (\$725 million), Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) (\$724 million), Metropolitan Medical Response Systems (\$35 million), Citizen Corps (\$10 million), Rail & Transit Security Grants (\$250 million), Bus Security Grants (\$5 million), Port Security Grants (\$250 million), Driver's License Security Grants (\$45 million) and Interoperable Emergency Communications Grants (zeroed out). Several amendments affecting UASIs and other state and local programs were considered. Those amendments included:

- APPROVED to strike language relating to the top 10 highest risk urban areas;
- APPROVED to remove language in HR 2017 that would restrict UASI funding to only 10 urban areas across the country.
- DEFEATED –to increase funds for state and local grant programs

 — including UASI by \$337 million, primarily offset by a reduction
 in funds for border security fencing, infrastructure and technology.
- However, due to reduced funding, only 31 UASIs will be funded, which is down from 64 UASIs in FY10.

Administration Releases Regulation Reform Plans: The White House Office of Management and Budget (OMB) released a comprehensive report on regulatory reform that outlines plans from all Executive Branch agencies to streamline and periodically review regulations. Click HERE to access

EDA, ETA and SBA Announce Funds for Jobs and Innovation Accelerator Challenge

LOI Deadline: June 10, 2011; Application Deadline: July 7, 2011

The U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA), Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration (ETA) and Small Business Administration (SBA) announced the Federal Funding Opportunity (FFO) for the Jobs and Innovation Accelerator Challenge (Jobs Accelerator), which will fund regions to address gaps and opportunities for high-potential industry clusters. Funds can be used for commercialization, business formation and expansion, job creation, and exports. The Jobs Accelerator technical resources from 16 federal agencies and \$33 million in funding, with individual awards from \$1.5-2.2 million plus required matching funds. Awards are made to an organization or team eligible for three unique activities, each funded partially by EDA, ETA and SBA, supporting a single regional cluster. Access

Clean Cities Community Readiness and Planning for Plug-in Electric Vehicles and Charging Infrastructure

Deadline: June 13, 2011

The U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) National Energy Technology Laboratory is soliciting projects emphasizing the development of local and regional plug-in electric vehicle and charging infrastructure for their Clean Cities Community Readiness and Planning for Plug-in Electric Vehicles and Charging Infrastructure project. The U.S. DOE is interested in exploring ways that will prepare communities for successful deployment and implementation of plug-in electric drive vehicles. Projects should include policy implementation and planning elements that support the deployment of plugin electric vehicles and charging infrastructure on the local and regional level. Plans must also address infrastructure deployment for light, medium and/or heavy duty plug-in electric vehicles (including extended range electric vehicles). Overall, the U.S. DOE hopes this effort will help to decrease the nation's dependence on petroleum and reduce greenhouse gas emissions by accelerating the deployment of plug-in electric drive vehicles and electric vehicle supply equipment (EVSE). The U.S. DOE will award 10-15 awards ranging from \$250,000-\$500,000. More information is available HERE.

Each year a Greenway Award is presented to land trusts, local governments, and other organizations that are growing our nation's networks of greenways, blueways, trails and natural areas. These projects connect Americans to the outdoors and their heritage. Funded projects typically advance one or more of the program goals, including catalyzing new greenway projects; assisting grassroots greenway organizations; leveraging additional money for conservation and greenway development; and promoting use and enjoyment of greenways. The U.S. Department of Commerce's Economic Development Administration (EDA) announced its FY 2011 University Center Economic Development Program competition to promote bottom-up regional strategies that help foster business expansion and job creation in EDA's Chicago and Philadelphia regions. Accredited institutions or consortium of higher education, including community colleges, are eligible to apply for funding. USDA 2011 Farmers' Market Promotion Program Grants

Deadline: July 1, 2011

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Agriculture Marketing Service (AMS) announced the availability of \$10 million for the FY 2011 Farmers' Market Promotion Program (FMPP). Grants of up to \$100,000 will be awarded for projects that increase domestic consumption of agricultural commodities by creating, improving and expanding farmers markets, roadside stands, or community-supported agriculture programs. Eligible applicants include local governments, agriculture cooperatives, regional farmers market authorities and nonprofits. The main priority for FY 2011 funding is increasing food access in food deserts and low-income communities, though all eligible activities will be considered to receive funding. Healthy Food Financing Initiative Funding Opportunity Announced.

The Healthy Food Financing Initiative (HFFI), funded at up to \$10 million for FY2011, will support projects located in food deserts and designed to improve access to healthy foods by developing grocery stores and other retailers. HFFI awards will be funded through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) via its Community Economic Development program to provide resources from HHS, the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Department of the Treasury.
