EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Colleagues,

NARC congratulates President-Elect Obama and Vice President-Elect Biden, and new and returning members of Congress and Governors. We also applaud Senator McCain, Governor Palin and their valiant campaign effort. We look forward to bipartisan relationships with the 111th Congress, the new Administration and the Governors as we work to improve regions nationwide. We dedicate this issue of *eRegions* to the 2008 elections, giving you a preview of what 2009 will look like with a new Administration and Congress. Below you will find a current list of winners by state. Please note that this is subject to change as ballot counting continues.

Democrats picked up Senate seats but are not likely to capture the 60 seats needed for a filibuster-proof majority. A few other races were close or still in contention. The Minnesota Senate seat is still undecided with a 42% to 42% Coleman/Franken split and pending recount. Udall has been projected the winner in Colorado over Schaffer and Senate Minority leader McConnell retained his seat in KY. Oregon is still up for grabs between Smith and Merkley at 47% each. And it looks like a runoff in Georgia between Chambliss and Martin.

Democrats grabbed a historic 254 House seats with a number of states changing hands including battleground New Mexico, signaling the largest House majority for the Democrats in 15 years. In response to the news of the elections House Minority Leader John Boehner (R-Ohio) asked his party to keep him on as their leader in the next Congress to ensure republicans do not "stand aside for the next two years, abandon our principles, and give the new administration and the Democratic leaders of Congress a free pass." Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-Calif.) spent Wednesday outlining her goals for the first 100 days of the next Congress, *Roll Call* reported, but warned that lawmakers will have "diminished options" when it comes to spending.

We will continue to send regular election updates and political discussions and look forward to 2009.

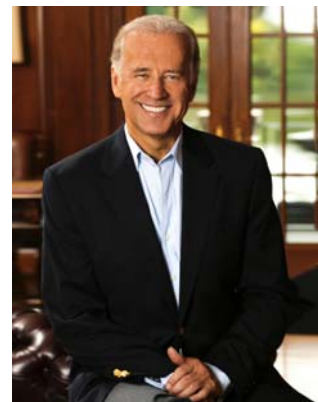

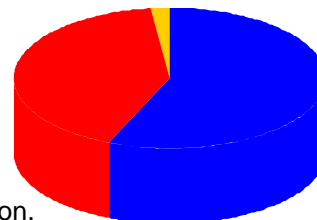

The Democrats won 17 seats (39 seats were not up for election) and the Republicans 14 seats (26 seats not up for election) respectively in this election.

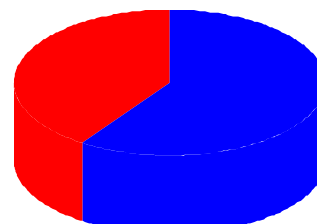
As it currently stands, the Democrats control 56 seats (with the two Independents caucusing as Democrats). Four Senate seats have yet to be decided. With these numbers, the Democrats maintain control of the Senate, but are four shy of having a filibuster-proof margin.



HOUSE

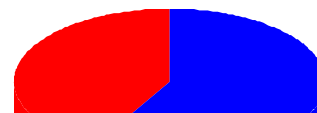
Democrat—258

GOVERNORS

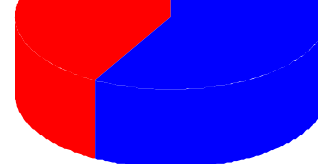
