# **POLICYUPDATE**

Congress is in session.

**Sequester Update:** Congress is working on legislation to address the impending March 1 sequester cuts (\$85B in cuts). It is expected that much of the legislative business this week will focus on this. The Senate is to take up competing sequester bills including, the American Family Economic Protection Act, a \$110B sequester replacement split evenly between spending cuts and raising taxes. If passed, it would delay sequester until January 2, 2014. Senate Republicans may back a proposal that would keep the sequester but would give agencies greater flexibility to manage the \$85 billion in cuts. Under the plan to grant flexible spending or reprogramming authority, departments and agencies would be allowed to make alternative spending cuts rather than having all accounts cut by a fixed percentage. The plan would apply to both defense and domestic programs. Another Senate Republican plan, S. 263, offered by Sen. Ayotte (R-NH), would cover the cost of canceling the first year of sequestration by allowing the federal workforce to shrink

by 10% through attrition. The House is said to be waiting for the Senate's legislation. President Obama is pushing for congressional activity, wanting \$2 in spending cuts for every \$1 in revenue for a sequester replacement bill. He has stated he would support something with as little as 2 months in delay of sequester.

Workforce Proposals Introduced in House: Two proposals were introduced in the House Education and Workforce Committee to reauthorize and replace the 1998 Workforce Investment Act, which hasn't been reauthorized since 2003. Both proposals seek to improve and streamline state and local Workforce Investment Board activities and better strategically align training with high-growth industry needs. The Democratic proposal, the Workforce Reauthorization Act of 2013, HR 798, would outline a series of updates to the system. The Republican measure, Supporting Knowledge and Investing in Lifelong Skills (SKILLS) Act, "eliminates or streamlines 35 ineffective or duplicate programs" in favor of a block grant fund. The Committee will hold a hearing tomorrow on the SKILLS Act. NARC's policy on Workforce Reauthorzation and more info on both proposals is HERE. Senate HELP Committee leaders are reported to be working on a bipartisan proposal to introduce this session.

Secretary Vilsak to testify at House Ag Committee Hearing to Assess State of Rural Economy: Tomorrow Secretary of Agriculture Vilsak will brief the House Agriculture Committee on the state of the rural economy. Included in the 2008 Farm Bill, which expired last September, many Rural Development provisions were left out of the temporary reauthorization included in the American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012. House and Senate Ag Committee leaders are working to reintroduce long-term proposals this session. More information on the hearing, including additional witnesses is available HERE.
