## NEWS FROM WASHINGTON

*Senate is in session; House returns March 16*

### **DHS Funded through End of Fiscal Year**

Last Wednesday, the House approved a bill ([HR 240](#)) to fund the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) through September 2015 in a 257-167 vote. This "clean" bill was passed by the Senate, and does not contain any policy riders that would prevent implementation of the Administration's executive actions on immigration.

### **Amtrak Reauthorization Passed in House**

Last week, the House passed the *Passenger Rail Reform and Investment Act* ([HR 749](#)) in a 316-101 vote. The legislation reauthorizes Amtrak programs for four years, while cutting its authorized funding levels by 40 percent. Currently, there is no Senate companion legislation.

### **Senate Fails to Override President's Keystone XL Veto**

On Wednesday, the Senate failed to override the President's veto of the *Keystone XL Pipeline Act* ([S 1](#)). The vote was 62-37, five votes shy of the two-thirds majority needed. Keystone supporters could attempt to attach the measure to an appropriations bill, MAP-21 reauthorization, or a broader energy package to keep the bill alive.

### **Obama Announces New Initiative to Fast-Track Tech Workforce**

The TechHire program includes commitments from 300 employers—including Google, Microsoft, and Goldman Sachs—as well as local governments in 20 regions to encourage, train, and hire for new tech positions. The average salary in information technology is 50% higher than the average private-sector American job, and approximately 1/10 of all job openings are in software development, network administration, and cybersecurity.
