Our federal budget and sequester information has been updated to reflect the latest actions taken by Congress and the Administration. Of the many concerns we have with the Continuing Resolution (CR) is an issue in transportation that would cut the authorized amounts we can spend in the CR below what MAP-21 authorized. This coupled with the tentative passage of the bill in the Senate (see Policy Update) and sequester flexibility options are making this legislative budget cycle a high priority for us.

Continuing Resolution Update: This week the Senate will take up HR 933, a continuing resolution (CR) to maintain government funding through the remainder of fiscal year 2013. The bill includes full-year Defense and Military/Construction/Veterans Appropriations bills, restoring \$7 billion and providing more latitude to shift money among defense programs. All other programs in the bill are funded at FY12 levels and are subject to sequestration. The Senate bill will add three more spending bills — Agriculture, Commerce-Justice-Science and Homeland Security. Senate Democrats may push to give other domestic agencies flexibility for sequester. The current CR expires on March 27. Visit NARC's federal budget webpage for regular updates.

Workforce Update - Workforce Committee Democrats Walk Out on Key Vote; Republican Bill Slated for House Consideration This Week: Last Week 18 Democrats on the House Education and Workforce Committee walked out of the full committee mark-up of HR 803, the Supporting Knowledge and Investing in Lifelong Skills "SKILLS" Act. The Skills Act, which passed the committee with Republican support, is the majority's proposal that would reauthorize and replace the current Workforce Investment Act with a consolidated block grant fund, which democratic members oppose. HR 803 will likely be considered by the full chamber on Wednesday. Full bill text is HERE and NARC will send a member update with additional information and call to action before floor consideration.
