

POLICYUPDATE

Congress is in recess until June 3.

Senate Continues work on Farm Bill; Final Votes Still Pending: The Senate spent last week debating numerous amendments to the Agriculture Reform, Food and Jobs Act of 2013 (S 954). The chamber will continue to work through nearly 200 amendments upon returning from recess. Among the amendments to be considered is a proposal from Sen. Patrick Leahy to establish a pilot program for gigabit internet projects in rural areas. Older Americans Act Reauthorization Introduced in Senate: Last week Sen. Bernie Sanders, introduced legislation to reauthorize the Older Americans Act of 1965 (S 1028), which expired in 2011. The measure currently has 14 co-sponsors, but no Republican support. Sanders introduced a bill half the size last year's proposal in an effort to focus on reauthorizing provisions with widespread agreement. The legislation also supports a 12 percent increase in desired funding levels reflecting the growth in seniors served by its programs and the increase in the cost of services since the last reauthorization. Both Sanders and Health Education Labor and Pensions Committee Chairman Tom Harkin have said they hope to have a markup on the measure soon, but have

not identified a timeline. NARC is working with Senate committee staff and will have additional information and resources as the bill moves forward.

HUD's FY 2013 Sustainable Communities Research Grant Program

Application Deadline: May 29, 2013

The program is offering a total of \$500,000 for cutting edge research in affordable housing development and preservation; transportation and infrastructure planning; and "green" energy-efficient practices.

EDA Make it in America Challenge

Deadline: May 31, 2013

As announced by the Administration in 2012, the Make it in America Challenge competition, funded by a collaboration among EDA and other agencies, will partner with state, regional, and local economies to provide infrastructure, strategic planning, capacity building, technical assistance, and workforce skills training necessary to make American communities attractive for business investment. To be eligible for an award, projects must encourage in-sourcing, either through on-shoring of productive activity by U.S. firms, fostering increased foreign direct investment, or incentivizing U.S. companies to keep their businesses and jobs here at home, as well as train local workers to meet the needs of those businesses. U.S. DOT TIGER Grants

Applications Due: June 3, 2013.

The U.S. Department of Transportation announced the availability of \$473.8 million in funds to be awarded for National Infrastructure Investments (TIGER Funds). These funds will be awarded on a competitive basis for projects that will have a significant impact on the Nation, a metropolitan area, or a region. Investing in Manufacturing Communities Partnership

Deadline: June 13, 2013

The Investing in Manufacturing Communities Partnership (IMCP) program is an administration-wide initiative that aims to accelerate the resurgence of manufacturing and help cultivate an environment for businesses to create well-paying manufacturing jobs in regions across the country. Through an interagency collaborative, the EDA, Department of Agriculture, Small Business Administration and Environmental Protection Agency are awarding initial funding for regional

United States Department of Agriculture – Rural Business Opportunity Grant (RBOG) Program

Deadline: June 28, 2013

The USDA is accepting applications for grants to provide technical assistance to help rural businesses grow. This opportunity is also a part of the Investing in Manufacturing Communities Partnership initiative. Grants are available to support projects that will help small rural businesses gain access to strategic planning, capacity building and mentoring services that otherwise may not be available. Applications are also being accepted through this opportunity as part of the IMCP program to promote the manufacturing sector. Healthy Foods Financing Initiative – Community and Economic Development Program

Deadline: July 2, 2013

Office of Community Services (OCS) seeks to fund projects that will implement innovative strategies to eliminate food deserts and achieve sustainable employment and business opportunities for recipients of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and other low-income individuals whose income level does not exceed 125 percent of the Federal poverty level. Applicants must be a qualified Community Development Corporation (CDC). More information is available [HERE](#).

Department of Health and Human Services – Community and Economic Development Program

Deadline: July 3, 2013

The Community and Economic Development (CED) program will provide approximately \$16.3 million in grants (\$800,000 maximum per project) to Community Development Corporations (CDCs) for projects designed to address the economic needs of low-income individuals and families through the creation of employment and business opportunities. The CED program seeks to fund projects that address the personal and community barriers that must be overcome to help low-income individuals become self-sufficient. USDA's Intermediary Relending Program

Deadline: June 28, 2013

The USDA announced funding available to non-profit and public agencies serving as intermediaries to provide support to rural businesses and community development groups. Funding is available through the USDA's Intermediary Relending Program that provides loans to economic development organizations, which in-turn support rural businesses that might not otherwise be able to secure financing. USDA – Rural Cooperative Development Grants

Deadline: July 10, 2013 (online applications) or July 15, 2013 (paper applications)

USDA is accepting grant applications from qualified non-profit organizations and educational facilities to help rural cooperatives develop new markets for their products and services. The grants may be used to conduct feasibility studies, create business plans, help rural cooperatives develop markets and provide training for cooperative leadership. Grants are awarded competitively on an annual basis to Rural Cooperative Development Centers, which in turn provide technical assistance to individuals and cooperatives.
