PROGRAMUPDATE

Building a 21st Century Electric Grid: As part of President Obama's initiative to make America a magnet for jobs by building a 21st century infrastructure, he signed a Presidential memorandum that will speed the modernization of the nation's electric grid. This will help make electricity more reliable, save consumers money on their energy bills, and support homegrown American clean energy jobs and industries by making renewable energy easier to across the country. NACO Releases Report on Changing the Tax-Exempt Status of Municipal Bonds: This week the National Association of Counties (NACO) is rolling out a report examining the detrimental effects to infrastructure financing that the proposed plan to eliminate or cap the tax-exempt status on municipal bonds would have. Municipal bonds are essential to local government financing for infrastructure projects including schools, hospitals, water and sewer facilities and roads. According to the report, in 2012 local governments invested more than \$3 trillion in infrastructure through municipal bonds – or 2.5 times the federal investment. NARC is taking part in coalition efforts to encourage lawmakers to keep the municipal bonds tax-exempt status during upcoming tax reform debates. POLICYUPDATE

Farm Bill Passes Senate; House Action this Week: Last week by a vote of 66 -27 the Senate passed its version of the Farm Bill. The Agriculture Reform, Food and Jobs Act (S 954), which reauthorizes the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) activities for five years, would reduce current spending levels by \$23 billion. This is significantly less than the nearly \$40 billion in cuts outlined in the House version that is slated for chamber consideration starting Wednesday. Last week, NARC joined a coalition of agriculture industry groups on a letter to Members calling on the House to approve proposed amendments to restore mandatory funding for USDA Rural Development programs for the Water/Wastewater Backlog Program, the Rural Micro-entrepreneur Assistance Program (RMAP) and \$ the Value Added Producer Grants (VAPG). EPA's National Clean Diesel Funding Assistance Program

Application Deadline: June 25, 2013

EPA's National Clean Diesel Funding Assistance Program is soliciting proposals nationwide for projects that achieve significant reductions in diesel emissions in terms of tons of pollution produced by diesel engines and diesel emissions exposure. For more information, click **HERE**.

United States Department of Agriculture – Rural Business Opportunity Grant (RBOG) Program

Deadline: June 28, 2013

The USDA is accepting applications for grants to provide technical assistance to help rural businesses grow. This opportunity is also a part of the Investing in Manufacturing Communities Partnership initiative. Grants are available to support projects that will help small rural businesses gain access to strategic planning, capacity building and mentoring services that otherwise may not be available. Applications are also being accepted through this opportunity as part of the IMCP program to promote the manufacturing sector. USDA's Intermediary Relending Program

Deadline: June 28, 2013

The USDA announced funding available to non-profit and public agencies serving as intermediaries to provide support to rural businesses

and community development groups. Funding is available through the USDA's Intermediary Relending Program that provides loans to economic development organizations, which in-turn support rural businesses that might not otherwise be able to secure financing. Healthy Foods Financing Initiative – Community and Economic Development Program

Deadline: July 2, 2013

Office of Community Services (OCS) seeks to fund projects that will implement innovative strategies to eliminate food deserts and achieve sustainable employment and business opportunities for recipients of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and other low-income individuals whose income level does not exceed 125 percent of the Federal poverty level. Applicants must be a qualified Community Development Corporation (CDC). More information is available HERE.

Department of Health and Human Services – Community and Economic Development Program

Deadline: July 3, 2013

The Community and Economic Development (CED) program will provide approximately \$16.3 million in grants (\$800,000 maximum per project) to Community Development Corporations (CDCs) for projects designed to address the economic needs of low-income individuals and families through the creation of employment and business opportunities. The CED program seeks to fund projects that address the personal and community barriers that must be overcome to help low-income individuals become self-sufficient. USDA – Office of Rural Development

Deadline: July 5, 2013

The USDA Office of Rural Development has announced funding available to assist communities with water and wastewater systems.

Qualified private non-profit organizations will receive RFP grant funds to establish a lending program for eligible entities. This grant program is to serve a rural area with a population not in excess of 10,000. More information on this opportunity is available **HERE**.

Measuring the Value of Prevention within the SMP Program

Application Deadline: July 8, 2013

ACL seeks applications that will describe how to best conduct research

on prevention education, such as that conducted by the SMP program, to determine how to best measure and quantify the effects of these efforts. This research may include, but is not limited to, identification of methodologies for measuring cost savings or avoidance associated with SMP's fraud prevention efforts. Specifically, ACL is interested in reviewing and supporting applications that will describe how the applicant will: Conduct a literature review of methods to quantify the effects of community education on prevention to identify an appropriate methodology for measuring these efforts in general and within the SMP context; Determine how to best measure and estimate the effects of community education on health care fraud prevention according to the identified methodology; and Develop and implement, in conjunction with selected volunteer SMP project grantees, a pilot study to demonstrate the above developed measures and tools using the SMP program and the program's Medicare fraud prevention efforts. ACL plans to fund one (1) cooperative agreement at the federal funding level of \$200,000 per year, over a three (3) year project period, pending availability of federal funds.

USDA – Rural Cooperative Development Grants

Deadline: July 10, 2013 (online applications) or July 15, 2013 (paper applications)

USDA is accepting grant applications from qualified non-profit organizations and educational facilities to help rural cooperatives develop new markets for their products and services. The grants may be used to conduct feasibility studies, create business plans, help rural cooperatives develop markets and provide training for cooperative leadership. Grants are awarded competitively on an annual basis to Rural Cooperative Development Centers, which in turn provide technical assistance to individuals and cooperatives. USDA – Community Connect Program

Deadline: July 11, 2013

The USDA has announced its Community Connect Grant Program aimed to provide financial assistance in the form of grants to eligible applicants that will provide currently unserved areas, on a "community-oriented connectivity" basis, with broadband service that fosters economic growth and delivers enhanced educational, health care, and public safety services. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is seeking applications from cooperatives to provide technical assistance to small, socially disadvantaged agricultural producers in rural areas. Eligible applicants include cooperatives, groups of cooperatives, and cooperative development centers. The maximum award per grant is \$200,000. The grant period is limited to a one-year timeframe. Choice Neighborhoods Implementation Grant Program
