

POLICY UPDATE

The Senate is in session. The House is back in session, as of today.

NDD United Releases Report on Impacts of Austerity Measures:

Today a coalition of organizations representing nondefense discretionary (NDD) programs in ongoing budget debates, NDD United, released the most comprehensive report to-date detailing the devastating effects of budget cuts on core services government programs. The report outlines what programs such as housing, infrastructure and job training, among many others, are facing as a result of across-the-board funding cuts to federal agencies that support these investments. Farm Bill Conferencees Hopeful for Compromise by Thanksgiving

Holiday: While House and Senate Members leading the conference negotiations on long-term Farm Bill reauthorization have not released an official date, members have said they hope to arrive at a compromise version by the Thanksgiving holiday. Additionally, discussions around using savings provided for in an eventual compromise as part of a final budget agreement are still ongoing, though conference committee leadership are split on the potential benefits of such a move.

NARC and Coalition Members Meeting this Week with Senate

Leadership on Next Steps for Workforce Reauthorization: Over the next several weeks, NARC and other members of the Campaign to Invest in America's Workforce (CIAW) will meet with Senate Leadership to discuss bringing the Workforce Investment Act of 2013 (S 1356) to the Senate floor for a vote. The Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) Committee passed a bipartisan bill in July. NARC members are encouraged to contact your Senators and ask them to reach out to Senate Leadership to schedule the bill for floor consideration. WIA has not been reauthorized since 2003. Senate Aging Committee Examines Challenges to Senior

Transportation: Last week the Senate Select Committee on Aging held a hearing to discuss the unique challenges the nation's seniors, aging agencies and transportation departments face in ensuring that older Americans have access to reliable and affordable transportation options. Witnesses from both the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and the National Association of Area Agencies on Aging (n4a) discussed

MEMBERREQUESTS

Project Database Solution: The Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) is looking for an off-the-shelf project database solution that other metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) are using to manage their regional transportation plans (RTP) and/or transportation improvement program (TIP). The solution that SEMCOG is currently using was developed in-house, but they are considering replacing this with an off-the-shelf solution.

Capturing ROI: The Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission (MORPC) is seeking information or strategies from their peers on ways to capture or report direct value or return on investment (ROI) for their local government members. Ideally, MORPC is looking to provide something to each member on a regular basis. As an example, are there specific dollar values that can be aligned with programs/benefits that all members receive? What information is shared that helps members validate the investment?

Northern Arizona Council of Governments Highlighted in International Economic Competitiveness Report: Recently the Inter-American Competitiveness Network released its 2013 “Signs of American Competitiveness Report,” assessing the competitiveness landscape of countries in the North and South Americas. Cited for best practice in the report is the partnership among NARC members, the Northern Arizona Council of Governments (NACOG), Northern Arizona University (NAU), and the city of Flagstaff to construct the Northern Arizona Center for Entrepreneurship and Technology Incubator (NACET) facility. Wells Fargo Foundation and the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation

Deadline: December 16, 2013

Designed to support projects that link economic development and community well-being to the stewardship and health of the environment, Wells Fargo and the NFWF have launched a five-year, \$15 million initiative that will be used to leverage other public and private investments with an expected total impact of over \$37.5 million. Funding priorities for this program include supporting sustainable agricultural practices; promoting land and water conservation; facilitating investments in green infrastructure and energy efficiency; and encouraging broad-based citizen participation in project implementation. Department of the Treasury – Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFI)

Deadline: December 23, 2013

Funding is available for the CDFI Program, which aims to use federal resources to invest in CDFIs and to build their capacity to serve low-income people and communities that lack access to affordable financial products and services.
